

PermaJet profiles – student guide for TB

PermaJet Generic profiles are named in the following way:

NOTE: Profiles may appear in Upper or Lower case, the profile version may be designated by either a # symbol or a V, and this will have no bearing on your output.

Manufacturer	Ink Set	Printer	Ink Variation	Paper	Media	Profile Version
APJ	KC	2400	PK	Gloss	PGPP	V1

Example: APJ_KC2400PK_GLOSS_PGPP_#1 **or** apj_kc2400pk_gloss_pgpp_v1

If you have a bespoke profile made, it will be labelled like this:

Manufacturer	Customer	Ink Set	Printer	Paper	Paper Media	Profile Version
APJ	A N Other	KC	2400	Gloss	PGPP	V1

Example: APJ_ANOTHER_KC2400PK_GLOSS_PGPP

Manufacturer:

AJP refers to PermaJet

Ink Set:

The abbreviation OEM is used to indicate Epson inks on all Epson printers.

Printer:

This will usually be a slight abbreviation, e.g. "Epson Stylus Photo 4880" will be referred to as "4880".

Ink Variation:

"PK" refers to Photo Black ink and "MK" refers to Matt Black ink. Each ink requires a different paper profile. Currently, all the TB Epson printers use Photo Black ink. The exception is the Epson 4900 which has both PK and MK inks available for use, however you must the appropriate profile for the required black.

Paper:

This will refer to the PermaJet paper. These abbreviations will not always be the same as profile names are limited in characters. Note: the letters "DS" with a paper name indicates a double sided paper.

Media Setting:

This is the media setting the profile has been made for; you MUST select the same media setting in your printer properties. These will be an abbreviation of the media setting and should always be easily apparent, e.g. WCRW refers to "Watercolour Paper Radiant White".

Profile Version:

Will be largely irrelevant to you, you will probably only need this if you are in contact with our technical department and are experiencing technical difficulties.

Profiles are placed on the system by the technical support team in TB. These are available to all users in the printing lab.

You can place individual profiles for your personal use in your own account as follows:
Users > YourAccount > Library > Coloursync > Profiles

Photoshop or Lightroom may need to be restarted if it was open when you installed profiles into your account.

Also you may need to re-install the profile when you next open your account on the TB network.
